India has taken the right steps in this regard. The department of agriculture & farmers welfare, Ministry of Agriculture, and the National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India (NAFED) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to boost the initiative promoting millets towards the celebration of the International Year of Millets (IYOM)-2023. India is trying to bring millet back on the global map by building support, organizing & promoting millets, and millet-based commodities market.

Aims: At present, the diversity of millets has lost from 20% of the total food grain basket to 6% and this is dominated by wheat and rice. The aim of celebrating 2023 as the International Year of Millets is more focused and definitely addresses the important issue that too in the right time.

- *To inspire stakeholders on improving sustainable production and quality of millets.*
- *To draw focus on enhanced investment in research and development and extension services to achieve the other two aims.*
